## MAIN ENTRANCE/VISITOR CHECK-IN

Our Main Office at Bay View Middle School is located in the front entrance #1 by the circle driveway. Parents should enter school under the brown canopy and use the far right (East) door in the entranceway. For the safety of our students, all doors are locked at all times. When entering our school, you will need to use this entrance, press a buzzer, and be admitted by the secretary into the Main Office. **Every parent or guest to Bay View needs to check in at the Main Office, identify yourself, sign in, and wear a visitor sticker/badge if you will be remaining at school.**

We teach our staff and students that adults in the building who are unfamiliar to us should be wearing a visitor sticker/badge. This means that the guest has properly checked in at the office. If an adult in the building is unfamiliar and not wearing a visitor sticker/badge, staff and students are taught to report this to a staff member who will then approach the person or contact the office/Resource Officer.

## ANTI-BULLYING/HARASSMENT POLICY



We have an Anti-Bullying/Harassment Policy to prevent bullying/harassment at Bay View Middle School. Bullying/harassment has always been around in schools. Yet, when we look at it more closely, bullying/harassment is really at the core of many problems that occur in middle school including attendance issues and its effect on overall learning. We believe that if we have an organized campaign to prevent bullying/harassment, our school will not only become a better place to be, but will also increase student learning.

A team of staff from Bay View created a policy which includes a vision, definition for bullying/harassment, specific goals, and education for students and staff on how to meet those goals. [Anti-bullying Handbook](#)

Our Vision is: *Every person in the Bay View Community feels safe when they walk through our doors.*

Our Definition for Bullying is: *Repeated acts committed against another that interfere with one's school performance or create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment.*

You will notice, as you walk into Bay View, signs are posted indicating that bullying will not be tolerated. We will take all reports of bullying/harassment seriously, small and large, and want students and parents to be aware of this right from the beginning of the school year.

## CELL PHONES/IPODS/ELECTRONIC DEVICES



Students do not need cell phones or iPods during the school day. We have hundreds of phones and each student has his/her own iPad. Therefore, cell phones, iPods, or other electronic devices may only be carried or used before the 7:30 AM STRIDE bell and after the 2:40 PM dismissal bell. If teachers want students to use/bring a device to class, students will be informed. Cell phones and iPods in class can be a serious distraction in a school setting. They are sometimes used to text inappropriate messages, can be disruptive when they go off, can be used for cheating, and can be used to take or send unwanted photos or videos. Those with cell phones or other electronic devices in their possession (even if not using them) between the arrival and dismissal bell will have it confiscated and the following will occur:

- Students will receive an office referral resulting in detention
- Parent/guardian will need to pick up the electronic device and meet with Associate Principal
- Student may not be allowed to bring phone to school

## [ILLNESSES AND MAKE-UP WORK](#)



Our school guideline for make-up work is that a student has one school day to make-up work for each day missed due to an excused absence. Students do **not** need to get all of their make-up work completed and brought to school the day they come back. Students can view make-up work on-line in Schoology. When requested by you (if not available online), teachers will provide make-up work in the Main Office within 24 hours. Our office hours are from 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM. Finally, should you have any questions or concerns regarding make-up work, please speak directly with your child's teachers to make arrangements.

## [MEDICATION AT SCHOOL](#)

For the safety of students, medications should not be taken at school unless it is absolutely necessary. Any medication to be taken at school needs to be **brought in by a parent in the original container and with the proper medication forms** .

The medication needs to be in the **original container**, which indicates dosage amount and frequency of medication. These items will be kept in the health room. Students are not allowed to transport medications. Parents need to bring medications to school and take them home when a student is finished. This is for the safety of all students so there is no chance of passing medications between students. Medications will not be given to any student without the proper paperwork on file or if the medication is not in the original container. Below are the forms needed for medications at school.

**Over the counter medication:** Parent Request & Authorization to Administer Medication  
(only form needed)

**Prescription Medication:** Parent Request & Authorization to Administer Medication  
(Both forms needed) Licensed Prescriber's Request

**Inhaler Usage:** Inhaled Asthma Medication  
(only form needed)

It is the responsibility of the student to come to the health room at the designated time to receive medication. If a student has missed a dosage at school on two consecutive days or is very inconsistent on coming in for medication, a parent contact will be made. Medication administration will be logged on an individual sheet for each student. Parents who wish to review that log may do so in the office. Our policies and procedures regarding medication are for the protection of your child and all the students at Bay View Middle School. Thank you for your cooperation!

## [INDIVIDUAL HEALTH PLANS](#)

If your child has a medical condition that our staff should be aware of, it is important that parents contact the district nurse so that an Individual Health Plan can be created. Please contact our school nurse at 920-662-7946.

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## [APPOINTMENTS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY](#)

If your child will be leaving during the school day for an appointment, please send a note with him/her in the morning. Your child should bring the note to the **Main Office** during STRIDE. Note: When your child misses school for an appointment (partial or full day), it is recommended that you get an excuse from your medical provider indicating "the date and time" you attended the appointment and return it to the Main Office.

## [PLANNED ABSENCES](#)

Unless an emergency exists, all planned absences that are for more than 1 full day and not related to illness or injury, require the completion of a Pre-Excused Absence Form at least 48 hours prior to the absence. You can send a note or contact the Bay View Main Office at 662-8196 with the dates and reason for the absence and we will get a form to your student. The form is also available on the district webpage or you can click on the following link: [Planned Absence Form](#). This form requires both the parent and teachers' signatures.

## [Your Child's Attendance](#)

- ◆ **Positive habits should be encouraged at an early age.** Make certain that your child attends school regularly, arrives on time, obeys school rules, and attends all classes.
- ◆ If your child will be absent, **contact the attendance line at 662-8184 each morning of each absence by 7:00 am.**
- ◆ Parents are **encouraged to make appointments during non-school hours**, if possible.
- ◆ Medical, mental health and/or dental **appointments will NOT be excused unless a written excuse is provided to the school by the doctor.**
- ◆ **Expect strong support from the school** as you establish family practices that promote school attendance.
- ◆ **Pre-excused absences** count towards the 10 allowable absences per school year.

## [BAY VIEW DRESS CODE](#)

At Bay View it is our belief that a student's dress/appearance should not be offensive or a distraction to a student's own or others' learning environment. We approach dress code issues with a corrective rather than merely a punitive approach. (i.e. students will be given the opportunity to correct first.)

### **Dress Code Guidelines**

No clothing which displays offensive, violent, obscene or suggestive graphics or statements will be allowed (e.g. "FBI: Female Body Inspector"); No clothing that displays references to tobacco, alcohol or other drugs, etc.; No chains, metal nubs/spikes, gang colors/affiliations, inappropriate wrist bands, etc.; No outdoor jackets may be worn in classrooms without individual teacher/school permission; No undergarments or inappropriate body parts may be showing; No clothing can be worn in a manner in which it was unintended to be worn (i.e. altering the position, length, consistency of the clothing). This list is not all inclusive and the Principal or Associate Principal will make the final determinations regarding dress code.

### **Dress Code Violation Procedure**

Staff members will record a Dress Code Violation in PowerSchool. Violation notification will be communicated to parents and STRIDE Advocate. After repeated violations, an office referral will result, and consequences will be given. Normally this will be an after-school detention, depending on the severity of the violations.

## SCHOOL HANDBOOKS




The Bay View **School Handbook** is our school's major means of communicating student programs, procedures, rules, and policies. **STRIDE Guide** – STRIDE stands for Students Taking Responsibility in Demonstrating Excellence. It is our support and discipline program and contains guidelines for behavior, consequences, and reward systems.

**Student Activities Handbook** – We have a separate manual for co-curricular activities which contains all activities, seasons, contact information, and our guidelines and policies.

If you have forgotten your password, click ***Forgot Username or Password*** to access it.

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## [DAILY AND WEEKLY ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION WITH YOU](#)

In an effort to provide the best home/school communication possible, you can receive DAILY ANNOUNCEMENTS electronically through PowerSchool. Parents must select this option in PowerSchool by selecting the email setup option.

It is important to keep the school updated with your current home address, phone numbers and email addresses, so that we can successfully communicate information to you regarding your child. We are confident that PowerSchool greatly enhances communication between teachers, parents and students—one of the most vital components to successful schools and student learning. ## STUDENT DROP OFF/PICK UP PROCEDURES:

As we begin another school year at Bay View, we will again focus on ensuring the safe and smooth arrival and departure of our students. To ensure the safety of each student, we ask parents to review and adhere to following procedures.



**Students Being Dropped Off/Picked Up** – Parents are asked to drop off and pick up children **on the west side of Cardinal Lane and along Wooddale Avenue** (north or south side of the road and west of the far west crosswalk). You may also drop off and pick up on Jaymar Street. Students are reminded to use the sidewalks, crosswalks, and walk to the building and wait for permission to enter the building at 7:24 AM. There should be no traffic on school grounds for drop off or pick up. Parents may use the circle entrance during the regular school day when conducting school business.

**Students Walking** – Students must stay on the sidewalk area in front of school and at no time should they stand in the driveway or any other traffic area. Students are also reminded to utilize and obey the crossing guards at the designated areas.

**Building Entrance** – Only doors #1 and #4 should be used for entry/exit by those students who are walking, riding bikes or being dropped off:

- **DROP OFF, PICK UP AND WALKERS** — Students coming from the North on Cardinal Lane and from the East on Wooddale Avenue should gather at the Main Entrance #1. Students coming from the West on Wooddale Avenue should gather at Entrance #4.
- **BIKE RIDERS** — Remember to follow and obey all rules of safety for bike riding, as well as, directions from crossing guards. When arriving at school, students need to follow the sidewalks and go directly to the bike racks located at Entrance #4. Students stay at the bike rack area and wait to be permitted into the building by the supervisor at the bike racks. Students are not allowed to ride bikes across any school parking lot at any time. When leaving school, exit through these same doors.
- **BUS RIDERS** — Students will enter and exit the building through the Galley Doors (Entrance #8).




