Incoming 7th Graders and Parents

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL Tuesday, Sept. 1, 2015

Students enter school at 7:19 AM and classes begin at 7:25 AM. School ends at 2:35 PM. Please see the enclosed articles on drop-off/pick-up procedures and bus information for specifics on where students should go when they arrive and depart school.

PICTURE DAY IS THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL!

Picture day at Bay View is scheduled for Tuesday, September 1. There is no need to send money beforehand. Your child will come home from school with two proofs and you can choose to purchase photos if you wish. Orders will be delivered to school in 2-3 weeks and will be distributed through your child's STRIDE teacher.

Course Description:

"The Bay View Way" – (Grade 7 and new Middle School students). This shortened special summer class is essential to help students transition to Bay View Middle School. Walk-In Registration:

You may register your child by coming to the Bay View office between the hours of 7:00—2:00 PM and a staff member will register your child for you. Payment is required at the time of registration.

FEE:

The cost of this class is \$10.00. This course is non-refundable unless the class is canceled. Payment by credit card or cash.



PARENT POWERSCHOOL ACCESS

Parents have access to courses, assignments and grades online through our online grade book software called PowerSchool. You were asked in past years to create PowerSchool accounts to access



your child's school information. You will need to use the username and password that you created as your login. If you have forgotten or misplaced this information, you may contact the front office at 662-8196 or email <u>lorismit@hssd.k12.wi.us</u> <u>AFTER August 12</u>, and your password will be reset for you.

DAILY AND WEEKLY ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION WITH YOU

In an effort to provide the best home/school communication possible, you will receive DAILY ANNOUNCEMENTS electronically through PowerSchool. <u>Parents must select this option in PowerSchool by selecting the email setup option.</u>

REMINDER: School Begins at 8:00 AM on Tuesdays (beginning Tuesday, September 15)

Teachers will continue to meet in Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) this school year. Each Tuesday, beginning <u>September 15</u>, teachers will gather in PLC's from 7:05-7:50 AM to share best practices, review student data, plan together, and learn from one another. This practice has proven to enhance teacher performance, personal attention to students, and overall achievement.

Busses will run at the normal time and students will be supervised until school starts at 8:00 AM if bussed students cannot make alternate plans to arrive at 8:00 AM.

If you have not done so already, we encourage you to make plans before 8:00 AM Tuesday starts. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and

school starts for the 8:00 AM Tuesday starts. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding as we increase opportunities for teachers to learn and grow.

MAIN ENTRANCE/VISITOR CHECK-IN

Our new Main Office at Bay View Middle School is located on the east side of the front entrance #1 by the circle driveway. Parents should enter school under the brown canopy and use the far right (East) door in the entranceway. For the safety of our students, all doors are locked at all times. When entering our school, you will need to use this entrance, press a buzzer, and be admitted by the secretary into the Main Office. Every parent or guest to Bay View needs to check in at the Main Office, identify yourself, sign in and wear a visitor sticker if you will be remaining at school.

We teach our staff and students that adults in the building who are unfamiliar to us should be wearing a visitor sticker. This means that the guest has properly checked in at the office. If an adult in the building is unfamiliar and not wearing a visitor sticker, staff and students are taught to report this to a staff member who will then approach the person or contact the office.

ANTI-BULLYING/HARASSMENT POLICY

We have an Anti-Bullying/Harassment Policy to prevent bullying/harassment at Bay View Middle School. Bullying/harassment has always been around in schools. Yet, when we look at it more closely, bullying/ harassment is really at the core of many problems that occur in middle school including attendance issues and its effect on overall learning. We believe that if we have an organized campaign to prevent bullying/ harassment, our school will not only become a better place to be, but will also increase student learning.



A team of staff from Bay View created a policy which includes a vision, definition for bullying/harassment, specific goals, and education for students and staff on how to meet those goals.

<u>Our Vision is:</u> Every person in the Bay View Community feels safe when they walk through our doors. <u>Our Definition for Bullying is:</u> Bullying/harassment is hurting others on purpose through words or actions over time.

You will notice, as you walk into Bay View, signs are posted indicating that bullying will not be tolerated. We will take all reports of bullying/harassment seriously, small and large, and want students and parents to be aware of this right from the beginning of the school year.

We are confident that you will agree that a middle school that is free of bullying and violence is what we want for all of our students. When students feel safe, they learn better. This is our goal, and TOGETHER, we will make it happen.



CELL PHONES/IPODS/ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students do not need their cell phones or iPods during the school day. We have hundreds of phones and each student has his/her own iPad. Therefore, cell phones, ipods, or other electronic devices may only be carried or used before the 7:25 AM STRIDE bell and after the 2:35 PM dismissal bell. If teachers want students to use/ bring a device to class, students will be informed. Cell phones and ipods in class can be a serious distraction in a school setting. They are sometimes used to text inappropriate messages, can be disruptive when they go off, can be used for cheating, and can be used to take or send unwanted photos or videos. Those with cell phones or other electronic devices in their possession between the arrival and dismissal bell will have it confiscated and the following will occur:

- Students will receive an office referral resulting in discipline
- Parent/guardian will need to pick up the electronic device and meet with principal
- Student may not be allowed to bring phone to school

ABSENCES

When reporting an absence, parents need to call our school's attendance line prior to the start of <u>each school day</u> your child is absent.

APPOINTMENTS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

If your child will be leaving during the school day for an appointment, please send a note with him/her in the morning. Your child should bring the note to the **Student Center (across from the new main office) for a pass** during STRIDE. Note: When your child misses school for an appointment (partial or full day), it is recommended that you get an excuse from your medical provider indicating "the date and time" you attended the appointment and return it to the front office.

TARDY

Students are given every opportunity to be punctual for school and/or class. A student who is tardy will receive a debit and will be subject to progressive disciplinary action for further violations.

PLANNED ABSENCES

Unless an emergency exists, all absences that are for more than 1 full day and not related to illness or injury, require the completion of a Pre-Excused Absence Form 48 hours prior to the absence. You can contact the Bay View front office at 662-8196 with the dates and reason for the absence and we will get a form to your student. The form is also available on the district webpage or you can click on the following link: <u>Planned Absence Form</u>. This form requires both the parent and teachers' signatures.



ILLNESSES AND MAKE-UP WORK

Our school guideline for make-up work is that a student has one school day to make-up work for each day missed due to an illness. Students do <u>not</u> need to get all of their make-up work, complete it, and bring it to school the day they come back after an illness. Students can view make-up work on-line in Schoology. When requested by you, teachers will provide make-up work in the new main office within 24 hours. Our office hours are from 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM. Finally, should you have any

questions or concerns regarding make-up work, please speak directly with your child's teachers to make arrangements.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

For the safety of students, medications should not be taken at school unless it is absolutely necessary. Any medication to be taken at school needs to be brought in by a parent with the proper medication forms .



The medication needs to be in the original container, which indicates dosage amount and frequen-

cy of medication. These items will be kept in the health room. Students are not allowed to transport medications. <u>Parents</u> need to bring medications to school and take them home when a student is finished. This is for the safety of all students so there is no chance of passing medications between students. <u>Medications will not be given to any student</u> without the proper paperwork on file or if the medication is not in the original container. You can print the forms needed by clicking on the links below.

Over the counter medication: Parent Request & Authorization to Administer Medication (only form needed)

Prescription Medication: (Both forms needed)

Parent Request & Authorization to Administer Medication Licensed Prescriber's Request

Inhaler Usage: (only form needed) Inhaled Asthma Medication

It is the responsibility of the student to come to the health room at the designated time to receive medication. If a student has missed a dosage at school on two consecutive days or is very inconsistent on coming in for medication, a parent contact will be made. Medication administration will be logged on an individual sheet for each student. Parents who wish to review that log may do so in the office. Parents may request to be informed if their child visits the health

INDIVIDUAL HEALTH PLANS

Your Child's Attendance

What Parents Can Do to HELP

- ♦ If your child will be absent, contact the attendance line at 662-8184 each morning by 7:00 am, to explain the reason.
- Positive habits should be encouraged at an early age. Make certain that your child attends school regularly, arrives on time, obeys school rules, and attends all classes.
- Parents are encouraged to make appointments during non-school hours.
- Medical, mental health and/or dental appointments will NOT be excused unless a written excuse is provided to the school by the doctor/clinic.
- Expect strong support from the school as you establish family practices that promote school attendance.
- ♦ Pre-excused absences count towards the 10 allowable absences per school year.

BAY VIEW DRESS CODE

At Bay View it is our belief that a student's dress/ appearance should not and will not be a distraction to a

student's own or others' learning environment. However, we approach dress code issues with a correcting rather than merely a punitive approach.

Dress Code Guidelines

No clothing which displays offensive, violent, obscene or suggestive graphics or statements will be allowed (i.e. "FBI: Female Body Inspector"); No clothing that displays references to tobacco, alcohol or other drugs, etc.; No chains, metal nubs/ spikes, bandanas, gang colors/affiliations, inappropriate wrist bands, etc.; No outdoor jackets may be worn in classrooms without individual teacher/school permission; No undergarments or inappropriate body parts may be showing; No clothing can be worn in a manner in which it was unintended to be worn (i.e. altering the position, length, consistency of the clothing). This list is not all inclusive and the Principal and Associate Principal will make the final determinations regarding dress code.

Dress Code Violation Procedure

Staff members will record a Dress Code Violation in PowerSchool. Violation notification will be communicated to parents, STRIDE Advocate, and the Bay View office. After repeated violations, an office referral will result, and consequences will be given. Normally this will be an after-school detention, depending on the severity of the violations. When in doubt, parents/students may check with Mr. Meyers at 662-8120.


BAY VIEW/LINEVILLE Parent Club

STUDENT DROP OFF/PICK UP PROCEDURES:

As we begin another school year at Bay View, we will again focus on ensuring the safe and smooth arrival and departure of our students. To ensure the safety of each student, we ask parents to review and adhere to following procedures.

<u>Students Being Dropped Off/Picked-Up</u> – Parents are asked to drop off and pick up children on the west side of Cardinal Lane and along Woodale Avenue (north or south side of the road and west of the far west crosswalk). You may also drop off and pick up on Jaymar Street. Students are reminded to use the sidewalks, crosswalks, and walk to the building and wait for permission to enter the building at 7:19 AM. There should be no traffic on school grounds for drop off or pick up. Parents may use the circle entrance during the regular school day when conducting school business.


<u>Students Walking</u> – Students must stay on the sidewalk area in front of school and at no time should they stand in the driveway or any other traffic area. Students are also reminded to utilize and obey the crossing guards at the designated areas.


<u>Building Entrance</u> – The following doors should be used for entry/exit by those students who are walking or being dropped off:

- DROP OFF, PICK UP AND WALKERS Students who are dropped off, picked up and walk to school should go in and out of the doors closest to your arrival/departure. Students coming from the North on Cardinal Lane should gather at the Main Entrance (#1 or #2). Students coming from the East on Woodale Avenue, should arrive/depart at entrance #1 or #2. Those from the West, should gather at entrance #3.
- <u>BIKE RIDERS</u> Students who ride bikes to school are strongly reminded to follow and obey all rules of safety for bike riding, as well as directions from crossing guards stationed throughout the area. When arriving at school, students need to follow the sidewalks and go directly to the bike racks, which are placed outside entrance #3. Once at the bike racks, students stay at the bike rack area and wait to be permitted into the building by the supervisor at the bike racks. Students are not allowed to ride bikes across any school parking lot at any time. When leaving, exit through these same doors.
- **BUS RIDERS** -Students need to enter and exit the building through the commons doors (Entrance #4) or the doors by the maintenance shop (Entrance #5), depending on where they are dropped off from their bus. They are reminded to take the most direct route when entering and exiting the building.
